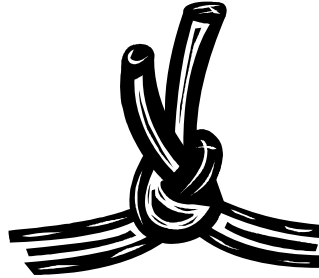


Building Connections: U.S.-Canadian Seminar on Race and Transnationalism
