I. Department Advisement

The goal of the Chinese minor is to enable highly motivated students from across the disciplinary spectrum to achieve an intermediate level of proficiency in the skills of reading, writing, speaking, and listening, and to develop an awareness of and familiarity with contemporary Chinese society and culture.

To ensure that you develop a coherent minor, you are advised to select courses in consultation with the Director of the Chinese Program. A student who has advanced language proficiency or is a native speaker of Chinese should see an advisor in the Chinese Program to arrange an appropriate program for the minor.

II. Applying to be a Chinese Minor

If you are planning to minor in Chinese, you need to:

- 1) See the faculty advisor;
- 2) Complete an application. Applications are available in the Linguistics Department, 609 Baldy Hall. After completing the application, attach a recent copy of your DARS report and turn it into the office. You will be notified by mail of a decision.

Acceptance Criteria

- A. Completion of Chinese 102 or equivalent
- B. Consultation with an advisor in the Chinese minor program
- C. Application and DARS report

III. Requirements for the minor

Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA in courses that count toward the minor, including the prerequisites.

Prerequisite Courses

Prerequisite courses are taken as needed, and placement in them is dependent on the Chinese language proficiency of the student.
